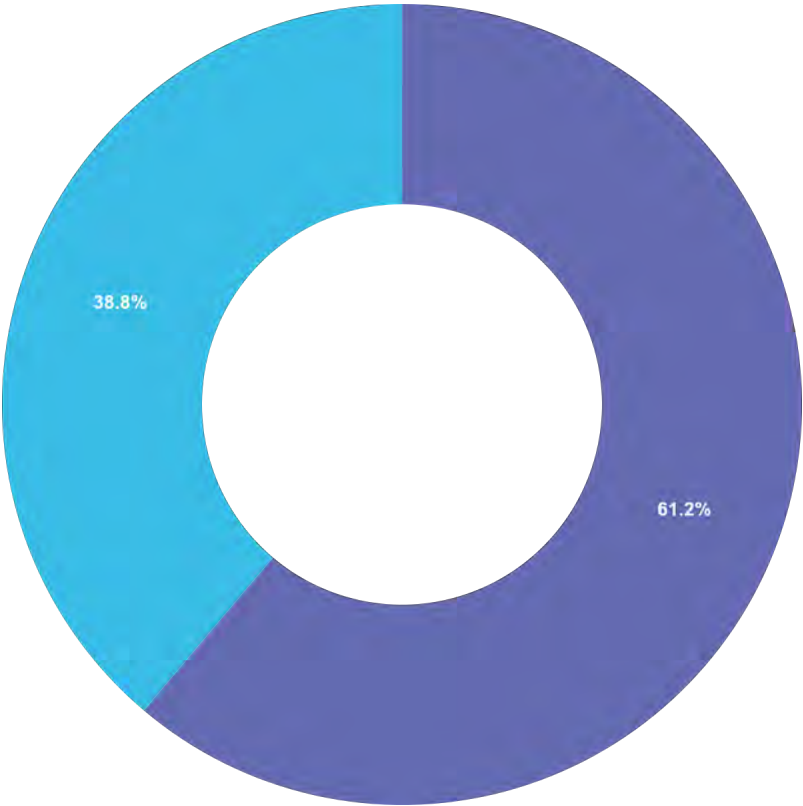

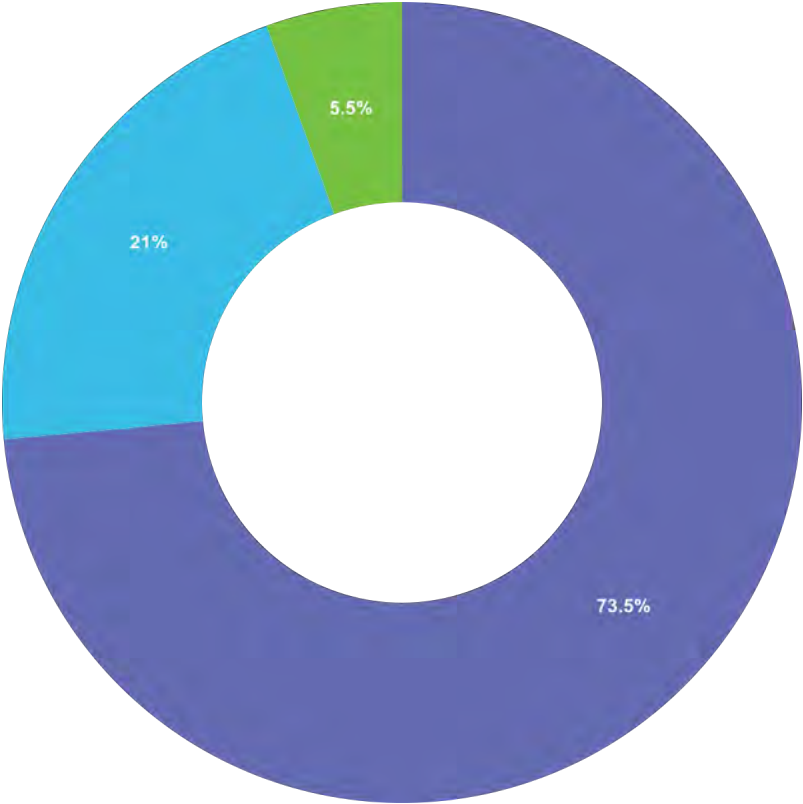
How would you describe your work status as a freelance medical communicator?*

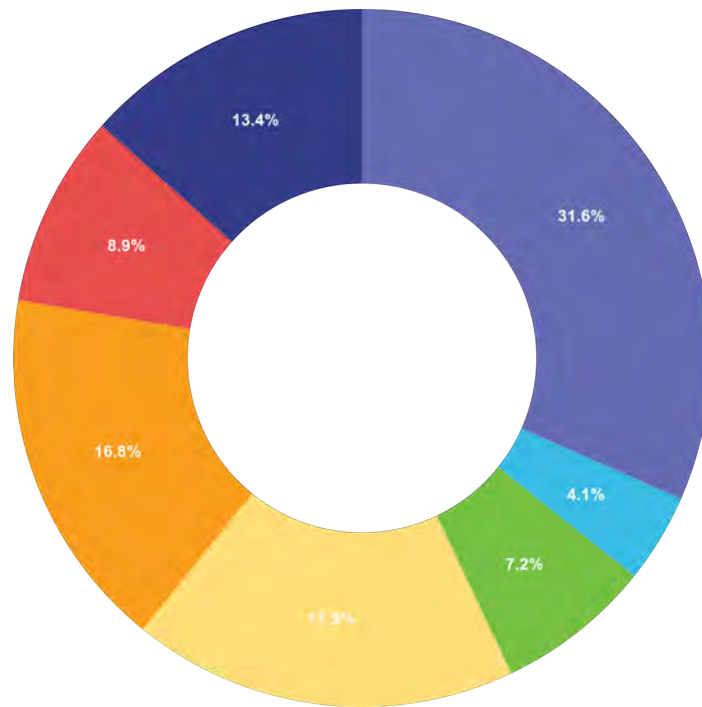
Q2 What is your primary function (>50% of your billable hours) as a freelance medical communicator?*

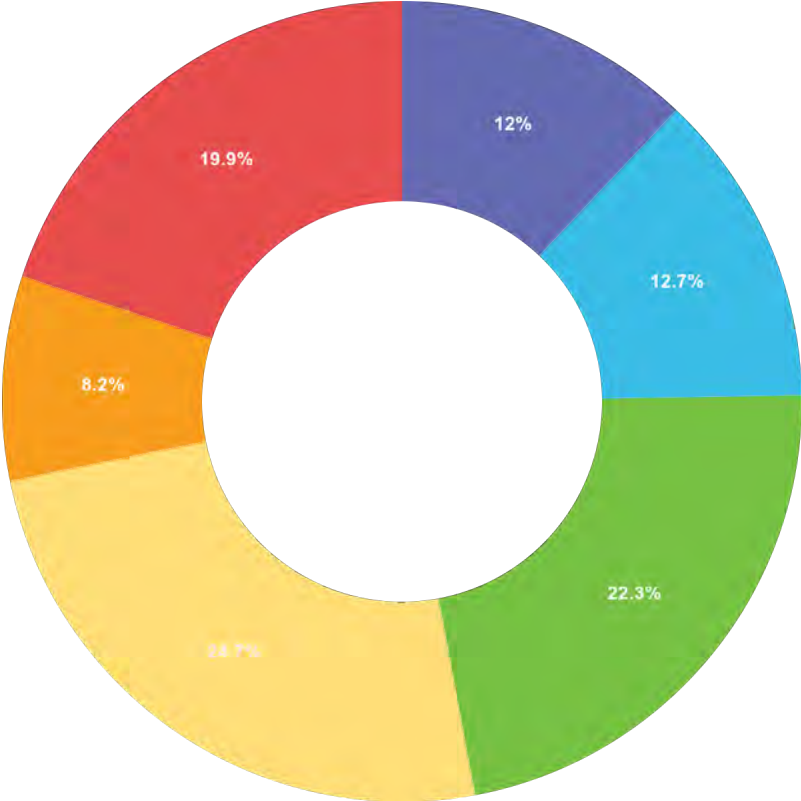

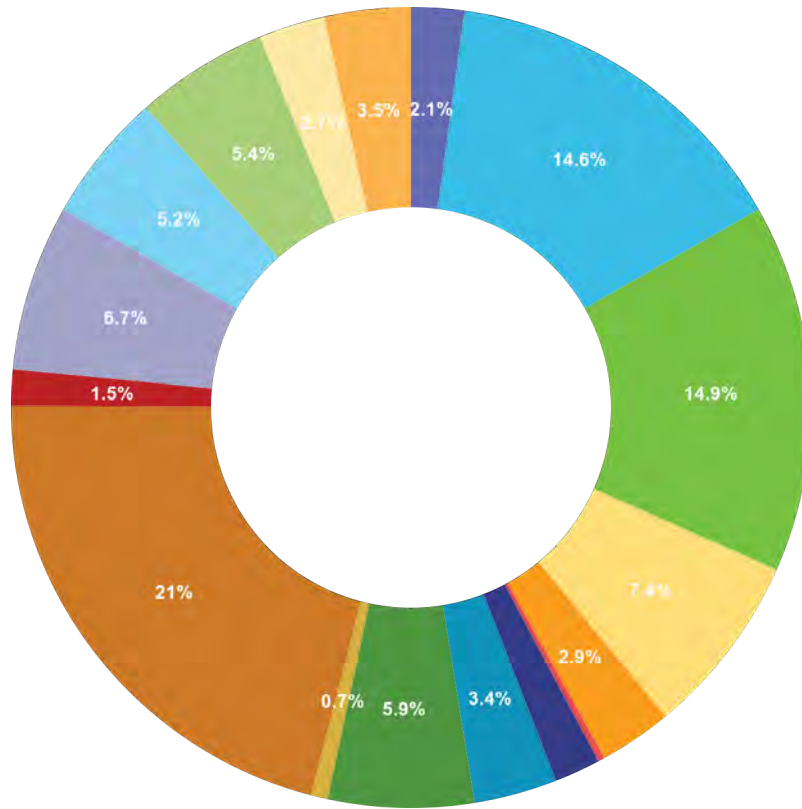
Q4 How many **total years** have you worked as a **freelance** medical communicator?*

Q5 Which of the following are your top 1-3 areas of freelance medical communications work? (Select up to 3.)*



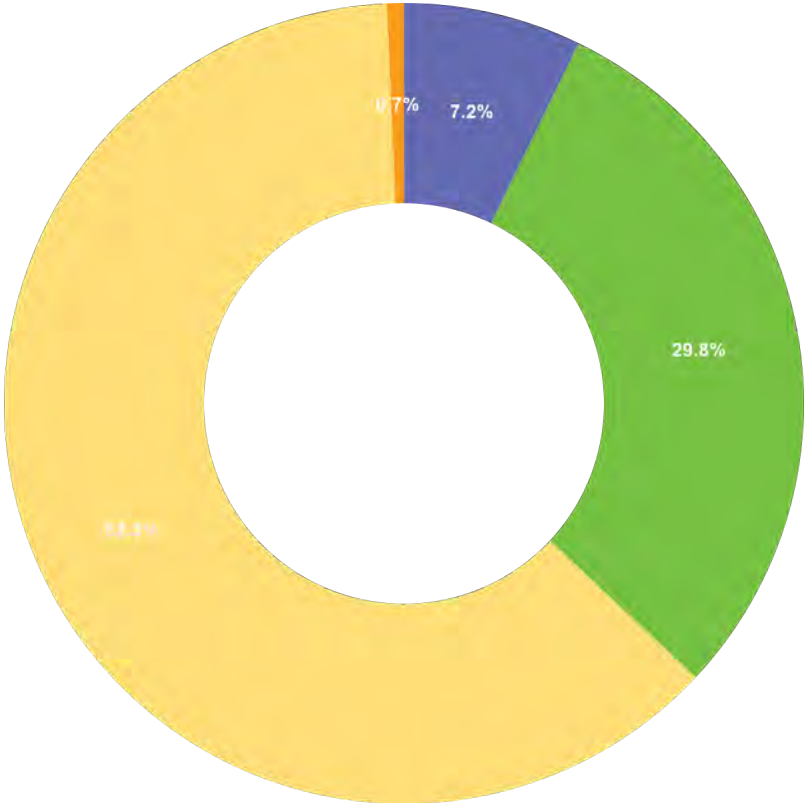

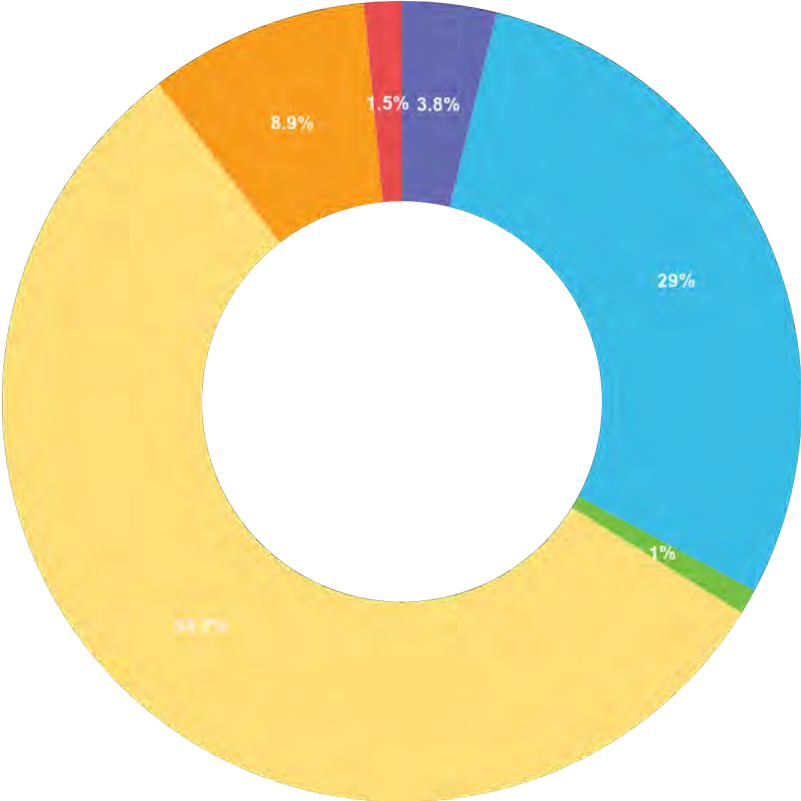
Q6 Which operating system does your main business computer use?*

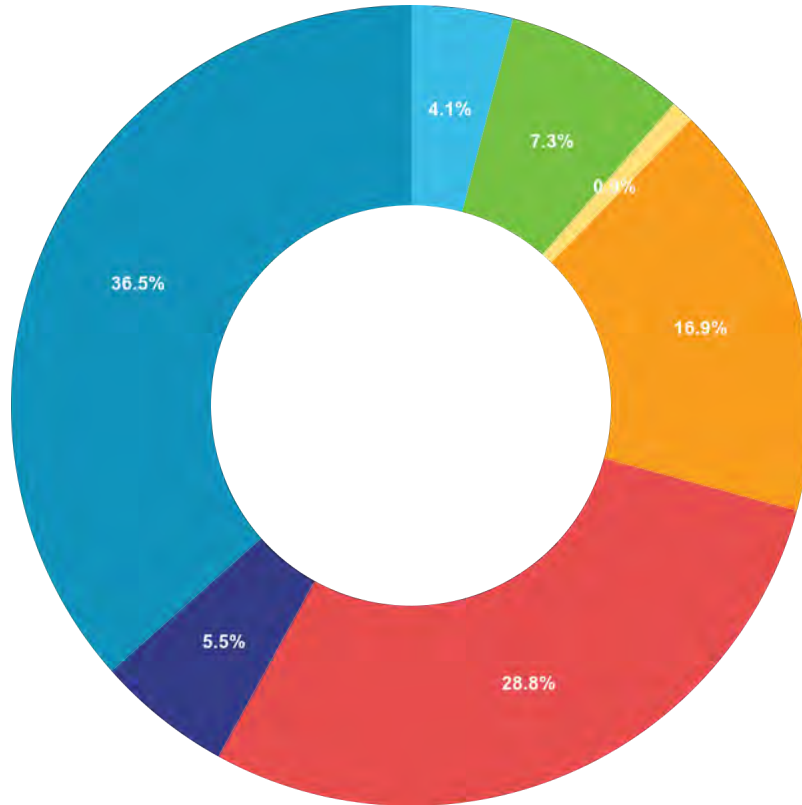

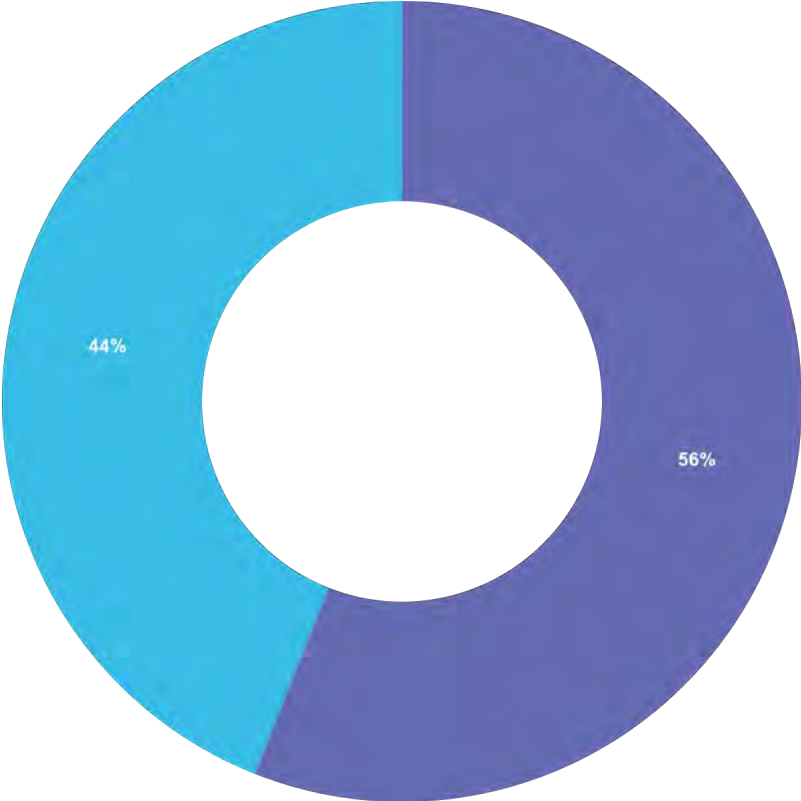

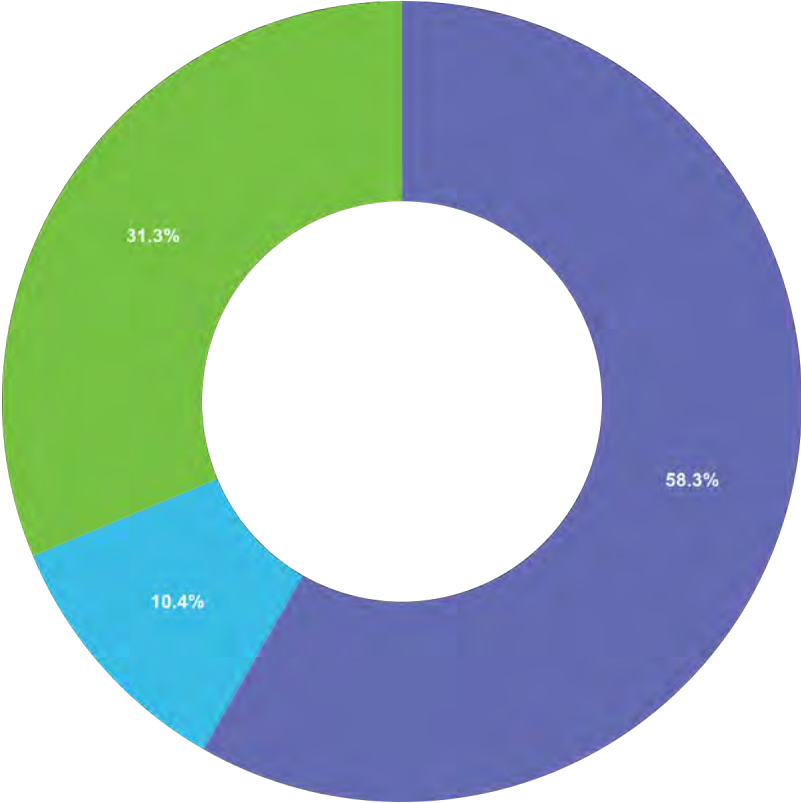

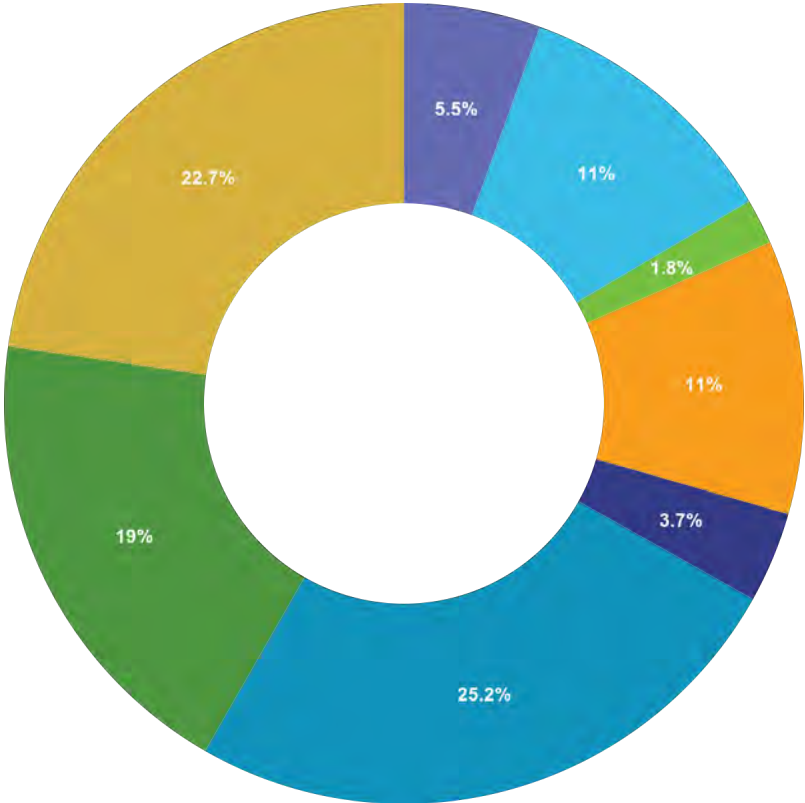
Q10 Who designed your website?*

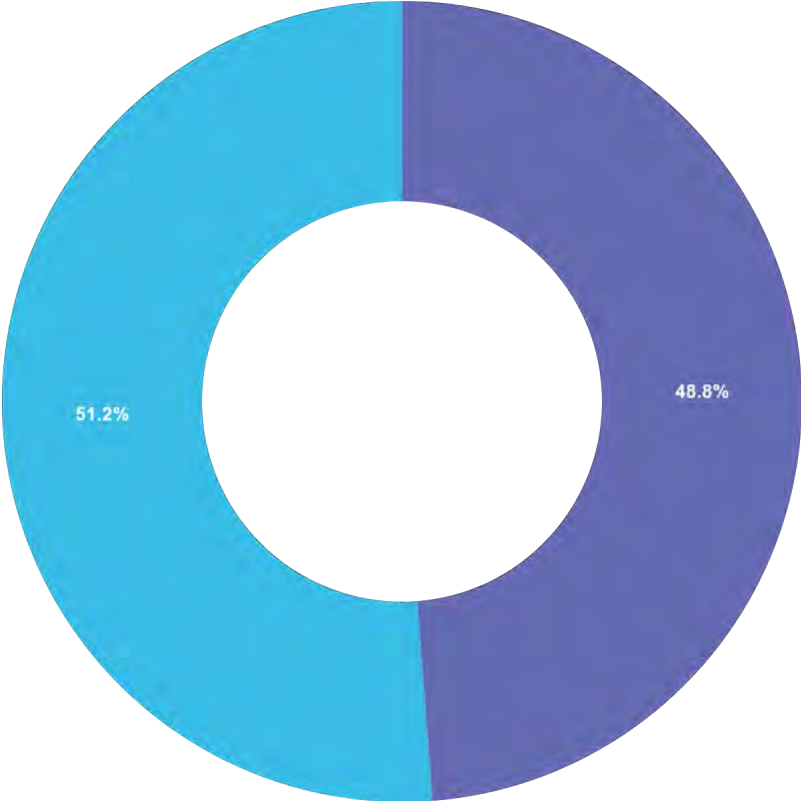

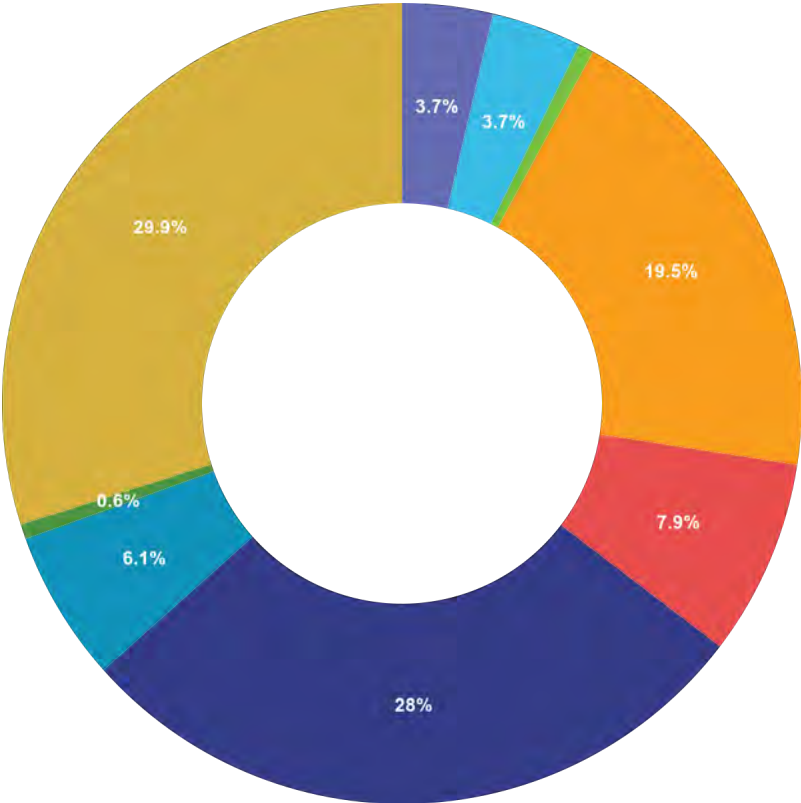
Q12 Do you use any software/app for accounting/bookkeeping?*

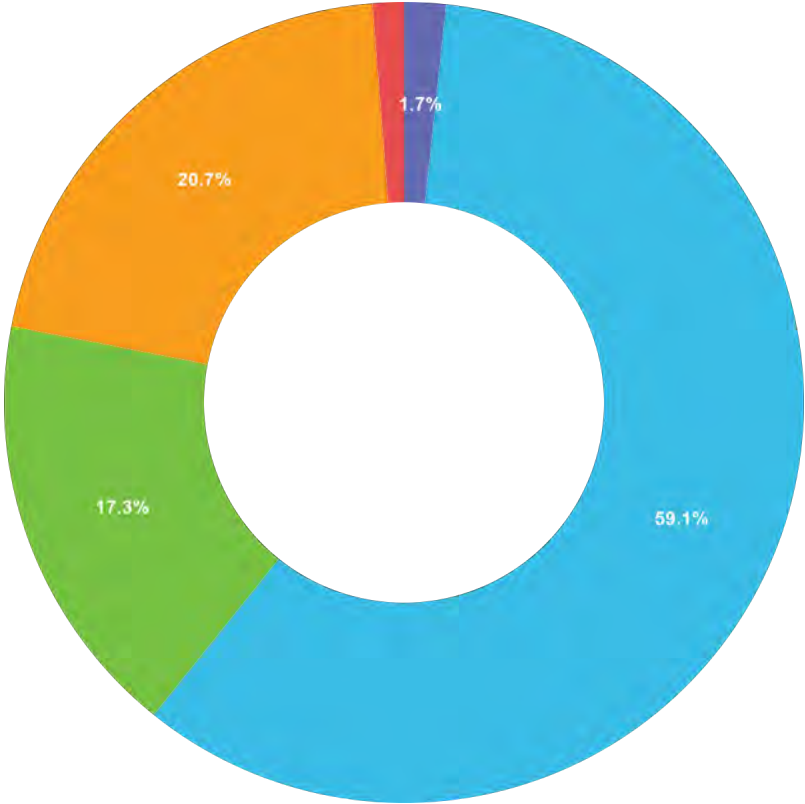
Q18 Do you use any citation/reference management software/app for your medical writing or editing work?*

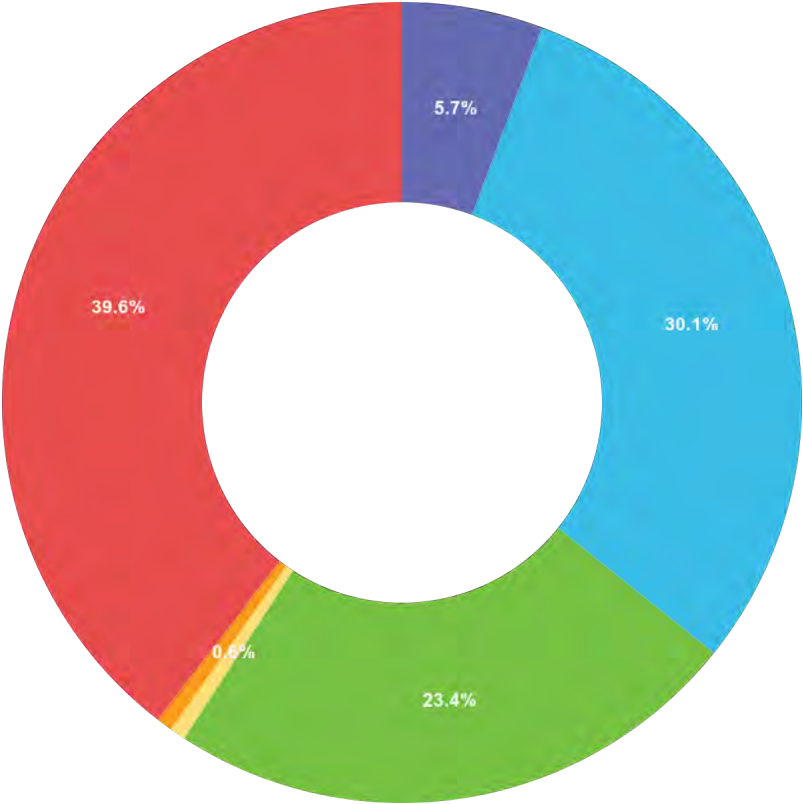
Q19 Which citation/reference management software/app do you use for your medical writing or editing work? (Select all that apply.)*

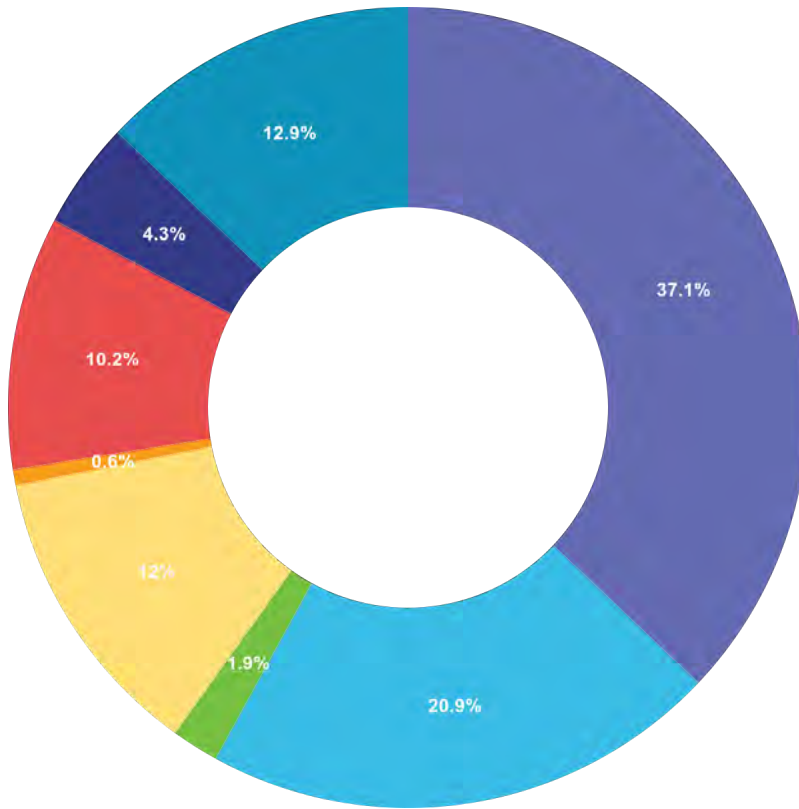

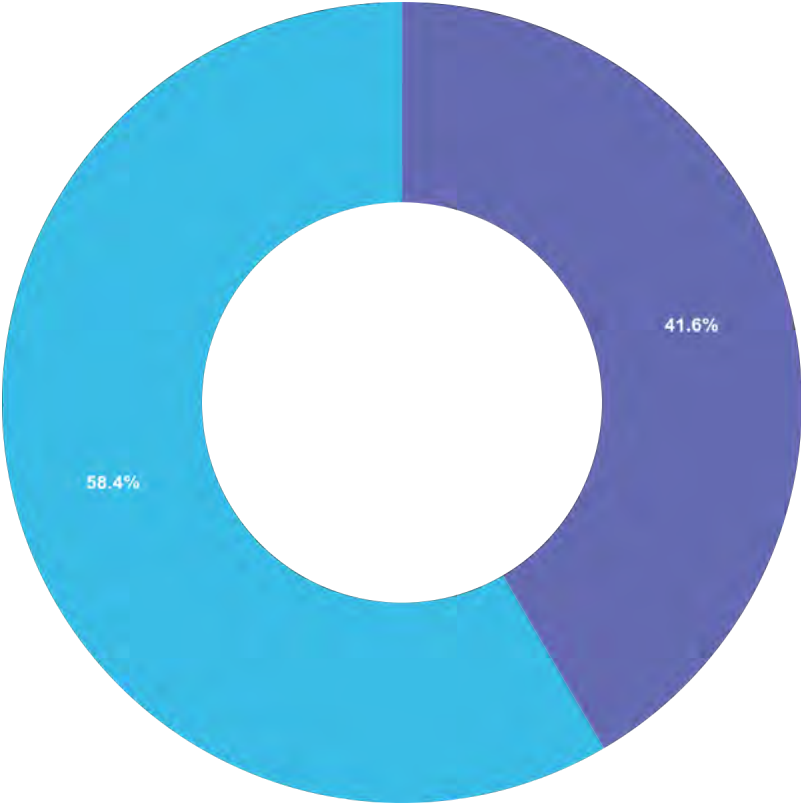

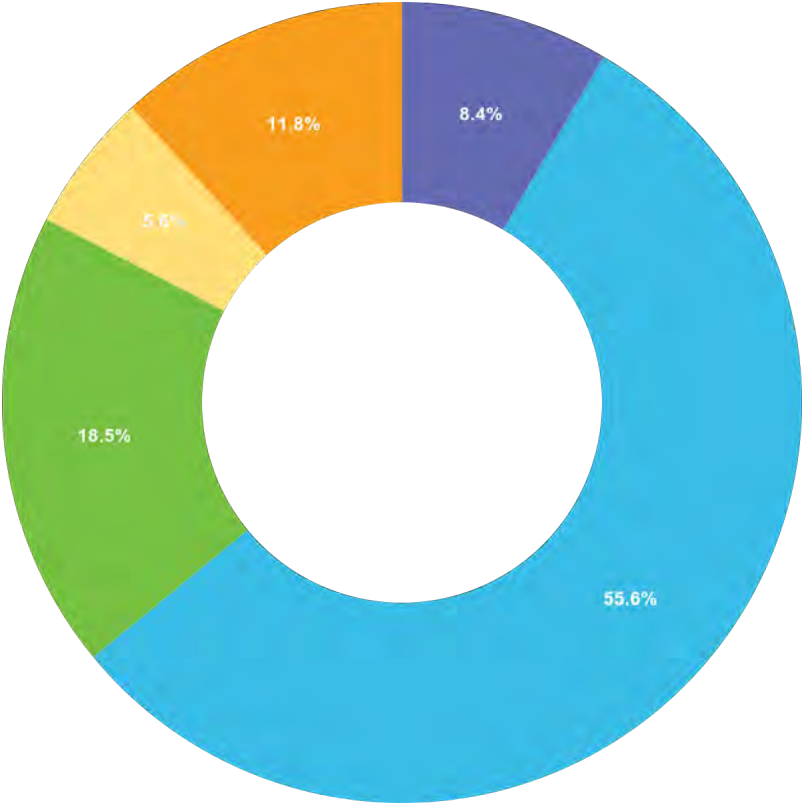
Q22 Have you used ChatGPT or other generative artificial intelligence (AI) apps for any of your medical writing or editing work?*

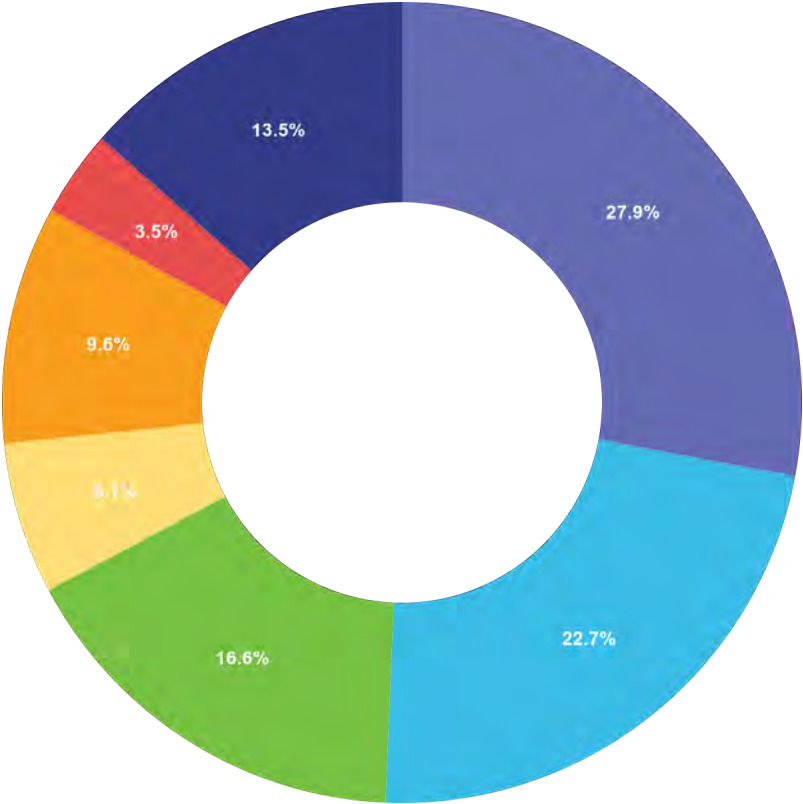
Q23 Which generative AI apps have you used for any of your medical writing/editing work? (Select all that apply.)*

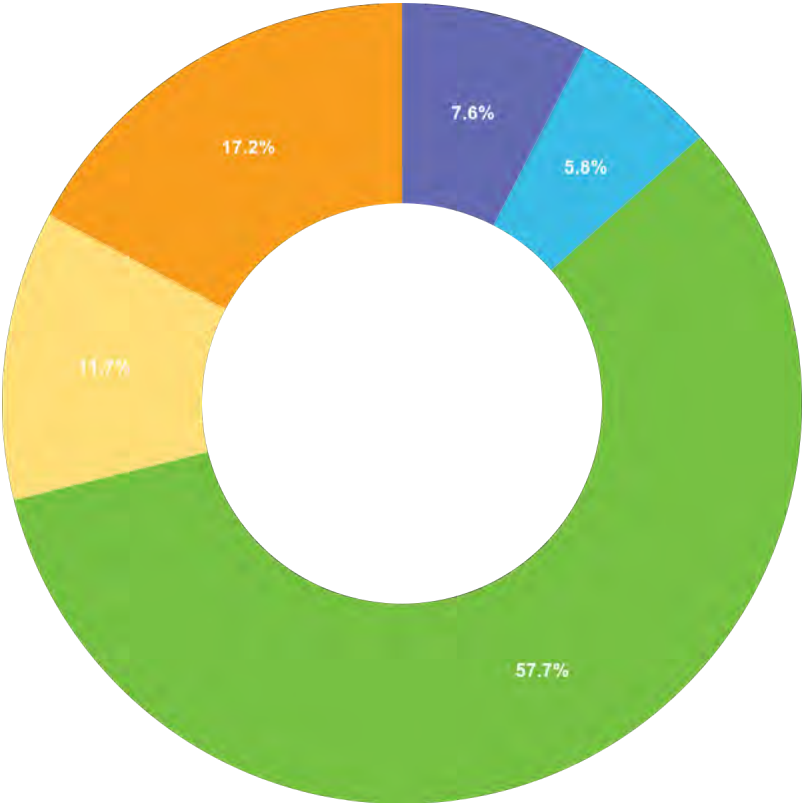
